<u>P.E.</u>

The children will have an outdoor P.E lesson each week as well as an indoor P.E lesson once a week. The sessions will be delivered by ourselves and coach on a Monday and Thursday. Please ensure your child has their PE kit in school on these days.

This term's activities will include 'throwing and catching', 'dribbling', 'balancing' and 'travelling'.



<u>Homework</u>

Home learning will be set each Friday and is due in the following Wednesday. They will consist of:



- A task linked to either the week's English, Maths or a foundation subject's learning
- Spelling practice

The spellings will be tested on a Friday. The children should be reading to an adult at least 3 times a week and also should be engaging with a wide range of other texts. A brief comment should be recorded in the reading record at least once per week. Please ensure school reading books and reading records are always in the reading folders every day. They will also have a 'free choice' book to read with and or alongside an adult.



This term Year 2 will be focussing on :

- Exploring duration and beat
- Preparing for harvest festival
- Christmas songs and music

Children will be working on their rhythmic skills as well as developing their performance skills.

English

As a school we will begin the year looking at the story 'In our hands' by Lucy Farfort. We will then move onto looking at the book 'The Magic Finger' by Roald Dahl. Among other activities, we will be using the book to inspire our own detailed character descriptions.

During the second half term, we will be looking at the book ' George's Marvellous Medicine' and create our own set of instructions.



<u>Maths</u>

Throughout the term the children will be developing their understanding of the following key skills and concepts:

- Number and place value
- Using their 2, 5 and 10 times

tables to explore problems.

- Number: addition and subtraction
- Money
- Multiplication and division.

Every week the children will have an arithmetic test.



Science

In Science this term, the children will be learning about the uses of everyday materials. The children will be beginning to identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials for particular uses (wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick/rock, paper and cardboard). This will lead onto them finding out how the shapes of some solid objects can be changed by squashing, bending, stretching and

twisting.



<u>History</u>

In our History lessons this half term we will looking at who we remember on Remembrance Day and why it is important to remember. We will be looking at images of the trenches from WW1 and exploring why people today buy and wear poppies.

<u>Geography</u>

After half term, we will be starting our Geography unit on continents and oceans. The children will be lo-

cating and describing the different oceans and continents on a map. As well this, they will look at the physical and human features of a continent.

Computing

This half term the children will be learning about digital photography. The children will be learning to recognise the different devices that can be used to capture photographs and will gain experience capturing, editing and improving photos.

After half term, the children will be learning about information technology around us. They will identify IT and how its responsible use improves our world and school and

. beyond.



Art and Design & <u>Technology</u>

This term the children will be studying a unit called 'Drawing; Tell a Story'. We will be using storybook illustrations as a stimulus so children can develop their mark-making to explore a wider range of tools.

After half term in D&T we will be looking at structures. The children will build structures using building materi-

als and exploring how they an be made stronger, stiffer and more stable through joining.
