English

In the first half term, we will be basing our English learning on the South African short story 'Fly Eagle Fly' by Christopher Gregorowski. We will look at the features of a diary entry and write our own, from the perspective of a character from the book. During the second half term, we will be reading the Anglo Saxon Legend 'Beowulf', which links suitably to our History topic. We will write character descriptions using Beowulf as a stimulus.



<u>Maths</u>

Throughout the term the children will be developing their understanding of the following key skills and concepts: Number & Place Value Addition & Subtraction Measurement- Length and Perimeter Multiplication & Division The children will also develop their arithmetic skills on a weekly basis and times tables will be practised and tested weekly in preparation for the national Multiplication Tables Check in the summer term.



Science

In Science, the children will initially be learning about living things and their habitats. This will involve looking at the positive and negative impact that humans have on the environment and food chains. The topic for our second half term is 'Animals including Humans' in which we will learn all about how our digestive system works. We will also learn about the different types of teeth we have and their functions.



Humanities

Our first History topic focuses on Britain's Settlement by the Anglo Saxons and the Scots. This will involve exploring some of the tensions of this period as well as the Saxon's ways of life. Our first Geography topic is Climate Zones. your child will be locating different climate zones and exploring the

differences between the Northern and Southern Hemispheres. They will learn about temperate and tropical

climates, drawing comparisons.



Computing

In Computing, initially the children will be examining devices capable of recording digital audio, which will include identifying the input device (microphone) and output devices (speaker or headphones). In order to record audio themselves, they will use Audacity to produce a podcast. They will then learn to identify inputs, processes,

outputs and how devices can be connected to make networks.



<u>Art and</u> <u>Design & Technology</u>

The children will develop an awareness of proportion, composition and pattern through drawing and printing. They will combine media for effect whilst taking a piece of work from initial design to final product. In D and T the children will be learning about different textiles. Within this unit they will select from and use a wider range of materials and components.
