English

In the first half term, we will be reading the Anglo- Saxon Legend 'Beowulf', which links to our History topic, and 'One Plastic Bag' by Miranda Paul. 'One Plastic Bag' ties in with our science topic, 'Human Impact'. We will write character descriptions and instructions.

In the second half term, we are reading 'The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe', and creating setting descriptions. We will also read 'Frindleswylde' by Natalia and Lauren O'Hara. We will be writing dialogue, birds eye view descriptions and persuasive writing.

Maths

Throughout the term the children will be developing their understanding of the following key skills and concepts:


- Number & Place Value
- Addition & Subtraction
- Measurement- Length and Perimeter
- Multiplication & Division

The children will also develop their arithmetic skills on a weekly basis and times tables will be practised and tested weekly in preparation for the national Multiplication Tables Check in the summer term.

Science

In Science, the children will initially be learning about living things and their habitats. This will involve looking at the positive and negative impact that humans have on the environment and food chains.

The topic for our second half term is 'Animals including Humans' in which we will learn all about how our digestive system works. We will also learn about the different types of teeth we have and their functions.



Topic

Our first History topic focuses on Britain's Settlement by the Anglo-Saxons and the Scots involving exploring some of the tensions of this period as well as the Saxon's ways of life.

Our initial Geography topic is Climate Zones in which your child will be locating different climate zones and exploring the differences between the Northern and Southern Hemispheres. They will learn about temperate and tropical climates, drawing comparisons.



Computing

In Computing, initially the children will be will examining devices capable of recording digital audio, which will include identifying the input device (microphone) and output devices (speaker or headphones). In order to record audio themselves, they will use Audacity to produce a podcast.

In the second half term, we will be learning to identify that digital devices have inputs, processes, outputs, and how devices can be connected to make networks

Art and Design & Technology

During the first half term, we will be focussing on drawing every day items in Art. The children will develop an awareness of composition in drawing and combine media for effect when developing a drawing. They will also develop their colour mixing skills.

In the second half term, the children will be making book covers in D&T. This will involve evaluating different types of fastenings, designing their book sleeve and assembling and evaluating their creation.
