<u>Homework</u>

Your child will continue to be set a list of spellings to learn through playing games on EdShed. The children then have their spelling test on Monday mornings.

For maths the children should practice their times tables on TTRS at least three times a week, this can be for as little as ten minutes each time. We are continuing to promote the importance of being able to recall multiplication facts in class. An additional piece of English homework will also to be set on Mondays, with weekend homework being set on Fridays to be handed in the following Wednesday.

This term the children in Year 4 will continue to learn to play the flute. They are now working in small groups, playing and singing together.

As the children develop their musicality, they will learn to play new notes and tunes.

<u>R.E. & P.S.H.E</u>

In RE we are continuing to learn about Islam. We will be

Following on from Islam we will be returning to our Christianity units of work. The children will be discussing how the Christian message has survived for over 2000 years.

English

Throughout the first half of the summer term, we will be composing non -chronological

reports on Scandinavia, which links to our geography topic. The children will be researching, writing notes and then writing up their reports for display.

In the second half of the term, we will be reading 'The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane by Kate Dicamillo. The children will continue to develop their comprehension and creative writing skills.



Maths

Throughout the term the children will continue to develop and master their understanding of the following key skills and concepts:

- Decimals
- Money
- Time
- Shape

They will continue to practise their arithmetic skills on a regular basis and the children will be setting the National Multiplication check in June.



Science

This term, we will be completing our States of Matter topic and moving on to our Electricity topic. The children will build their own circuits with several components such as batteries, bulbs, switches and buzzers and learn which materials are conductors and which are insulators.

We will finish with a topic on Sound in which the children will find out how sound travels through vibrations.



Humanities

This term, in history, the children will be learning about early Islamic Civilization (Baghdad c AD 900) , in order to discover how this society contrasts with British history.

Our summer topic in geography will be 'Mountains' in which the children will be finding out what mountains are and how they are formed. They will be studying some of the highest mountains in the UK and the world.



Computing

In our unit entitled 'Photo Editing', we will be developing understanding of how digital images can be changed and edited, and how they can be resaved and reused. The children will consider the impact that editing images can have, and evaluate the effectiveness of their choices.

We will then be exploring the concept of repetition in programming using Scratch to modify existing games.



Art and Design & Technology

In our unit of work entitled 'Every Picture tells a Story', children will develop their ability to analyse, unpick and understand works of art. They will also have the opportunity to create their own photo collages and abstract art inspired by the work explored.

In D&T, the children will work in groups to follow a simple biscuit recipe. They will then think about ways to adapt the recipe in order to improve it further.
