## **English**

This half term we will be using the book 'Kaspar, Prince of Cats' by Michael Morpurgo to base our English learning on. We will use the text to write a newspaper article and understand characters' feelings. We will also be reading and studying 'The Firebird', a Russian folk tale.

Spellings will be linked to the books we are reading.



## <u>Maths</u>

Throughout the term the children will be developing their understanding of the following key skills and concepts:

- Multiplication
- Division
- Fractions
- Decimals and percentages

There will be daily fluency practice to consolidate and review the skills learnt.

Arithmetic and times tables skills will be tested weekly.



### <u>Science</u>

In science we will be beginning our chemistry topic on the properties and uses of materials. Children will compare and group together materials and conduct fair tests.

After half term, we will be looking at 'Earth and Space', looking at the relationship between the sun and moon. We will also be exploring why we have seasons.

Children will be taking part in celebrating British Science Week.



This half term, in geography, we will be using our map skills to locate and name countries and cities in South



America. We will research some of the key physical and human characteristics of the region.



Next half term, our history topic is Ancient Greece - a study of Greek life and achievements and the legacy of Greek Culture.

# <u>Computing</u>

In computing we will be developing our understanding of computer systems and how information is transferred between devices. Children

will take part in a collaborative online project with other pupils to develop their skills in working together. After half term, we will be looking at data bases.



### <u>Art and</u> Design & Technology

In D&T this half term, we will be designing, making and evaluating our own mechanical toys using CAMs.
