English

This half term we will be using the book 'Journey to the River Sea' by Eva Ibbotson to base our English learning on. We will use the text to learn more about the Rainforest and the city of Manaus and will use this information to write our own diary entry, character description and eventually persuasive letter.

During the second half term. we will

read `A Christmas Carol' by Charles Dickens, looking at techniques to build characters, atmosphere and suspense.



Maths

Throughout the term the children will be developing their understanding of the following key skills and concepts:

- Number & Place Value
- Addition and Subtraction
- Statistics
- Decimals
- Multiplication and Division

There will be daily fluency practice to consolidate and review the skills learnt.

Arithmetic and times tables skills will be tested weekly.



<u>Science</u>

In science we will be studying 'Living things and their habitats'. This will link with our study of the Rainforests in geography.

We will investigate the differences in the life cycles of a mammal, an amphibian, an



insect and a bird and the life process of reproduction in some plants and animals.

<u>Topic</u>

This half term, in geography, we will be finding out about tropical rainforests, the animals and people



that inhabit them, their environmental importance and the threats they face.



In our history topic next half term we will be investigating the changing power of the monarchy using case studies of key monarchs. We will also look at the

Magna Carta as a key turning point in British History.

<u>Computing</u>

In computing we will be looking at creating vector images using a drawing program to create pictures made up of layers and groups of objects.

After half term we will be studying how computer systems and networks share information.



Art and Design & <u>Technology</u>



In design and technology we will be looking at the skills needed to design and create a pop up book.

After half term, our art topic will be focussing on Architecture, looking at why houses look the way they



do and the skills needed to create observational

drawings from different perspectives.
