English

This half term we will be using the book 'The Jungle Book' by Rudyard Kipling to base our English learning on. We will use the text to learn more about the Rainforest and will use this information to write our own diary entry, character description and eventually persuasive letter.

Spellings will be linked to the books we are reading.

Science

In science we will be studying 'Forces and Mechanisms'.

Children will explain that unsupported objects fall towards the Earth because of the force of gravity acting between the Earth and the falling object. They will identify the effects of air resistance, water resistance and friction, that act between moving surfactes. Children will also recognise that some mechanisms, including levers, pulleys and gears, allow a smaller force to have a greater effect.

Computing

In computing we will be looking at creating vector images using a drawing program to create pictures made up of layers and groups of objects.

After half term we will be studying how computer systems and networks share information.



Maths

Throughout the term the children will be developing their understanding of the following key skills and concepts:

- Number & Place Value
- Addition and Subtraction
- Statistics
- Decimals
- Multiplication and Division

There will be daily fluency practice to consolidate and review the skills learnt.

Arithmetic and times tables skills will be tested weekly.

<u>Topic</u>

This half term, in geography, we will be finding out about tropical rainforests, the animals and people



that inhabit them, their environmental importance and the threats they face.



In our history topic next half term we will be investigating the changing power of the monarchy using case studies of key monarchs. We will also look at the

Magna Carta as a key turning point in British History.

Art and Design & Technology

In art this term, we will be creating portraits using mixed media and collages.

After half term, our D&T topic will be looking into the processes from farm to fork, what makes a healthy meal and creating our own

healthy recipe.
