## English

This half term we will be using the book 'Journey to the River Sea' by Eva Ibbotson to base our English learning on. We will use the text to learn more about the Rainforest and the city of Manaus and will use this information to write our own setting descriptions, diary entry and eventually persuasive letter.

During the second half term. we will read 'A Christmas Carol' by Charles Dickens, looking at techniques to build characters, atmosphere and suspense. .



## Science

In science we will be studying 'Living things and their habitats'. This will link with our study of the Rainforests in geography.

We will investigate the differences in the life cycles of a mammal, an amphibian, an insect and a bird and the life process of reproduction in some plants and animals.



## Computing

In computing we will be learning how to create short videos and develop the skills of capturing, editing and manipulating video.

After half term we will be studying how computer systems and networks share information.



## Maths

Throughout the term we will be developing our understanding of the following key skills and concepts:

- Number & Place Value
- Addition and Subtraction
- Statistics
- Decimals
- Multiplication and Division

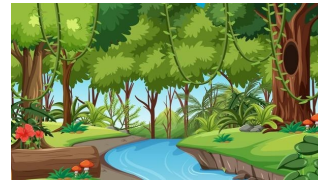
There will be daily fluency practice to consolidate and review the skills learnt.
