English

During the first half term we will be exploring (Greek Mythology to tie in with our History topic.

We will be reading a selection of Greek myths, discussing their key elements and writing some myths of our own.



During the second half term, we will be looking at non chronological reports and persuasive writing.

<u>Maths</u>

Throughout the term the children will be developing their understanding of the following key skills and concepts:

- Decimals
- Properties of shape
- Position and Direction
- Converting Units
- Volume

There will be daily fluency practice to consolidate and review the skills learnt.



Arithmetic and times tables skills will be tested weekly.

<u>Science</u>

In science we will be studying 'Properties and changes

of Materials'. We will be sorting materials according to their properties.



After half term our topic is Animals including Humans focussing on reproduction in plants and animals.

<u>Topic</u>

This half term, we will continue to study Ancient Greece - a study of Greek life and achievements and the legacy of Greek Culture.



Next half term, in geography, we will be building on our knowledge by studying modern day Greece as a contrasting European locality. We will find out about the physical and human geography of Greece today.

Our final History unit will be looking at Migration. How and why different communities have migrated to the UK and our multicultural society.

Computing

We will continue our work on video editing — planning, capturing, and editing video to produce a short film.

Our second unit is Flat-file database, We will be using a database to order data and create charts to answer questions.



<u>Art and</u> Design & Technology

In design and technology we will be creating electronic greetings cards. We will look at some cards and design and create our

own.

In Art, we will be looking at pottery. This will tie in with our work on Ancient Greek pottery and the children will design and make their own pots using clay.
