was magically fun!


Exquisite experiences

Using Christmas paper, cut a mini square measuring 11cm x 11cm. Fold 2 corners to the center.



2) Then, fold another corner to the centre and the final one, fold over, past the center point. Stick this fold with double-sided tape.

3) Next, stick double-sided tape onto the front of the envelope.



4.Get a piece of string that is 41 cm long. Then tie it around the envelope; take a merry christmas tag and thread the string through the tag and make a bow.

5. Next cut a strip of coloured Christmas paper that is 15.5cm long and 0.5 cm thin; stick it onto the bottom card.





6. Then peel off the double sided tape on the envelope front and stick down so the envelope is slightly tilted onto the card and on top of the strip of paper.

7. Take your wooden toppers and your double-sided tape and stick the double-sided tape onto the toppers. Stick as if the toppers are bursting out of the envelope.



8. Finally, write a message to whoever you want to give the card to and your done!
