Yes - I take out my Spring clothes and go on more walks.


8.What is your favourite place that you've visited?


The Three Pioneers




Art Competition Results:

Creative Writing Results: Christmas with an Elf excerpt by Matilda (5H)

It was a snowy christmas morning, frost was in the air. All of the lakes and rivers were frozen over with ice- so thick that you could skate on them. Everyone was fast asleep, waiting for Christmas Day... Father Christmas was slowly landing on the last house in London (my house) and was coming down the chimney, delivering my presents. He was too busy eating mince pies to notice a little elf with a green hat and a small, cosy jumper with bells around his neck...



<u>Ingredients</u>

350g Homepride plain flour

100g Homepride self-raising flour

100g granulated sugar

125g butter, at room temp and cut into cubes

120g golden syrup

1 large egg

Zest of two lemons

Decoration:

250g icing sugar

4-6 tsp water

Desiccated coconut

Dark chocolate balls (for eyes) or other sprinkles, light pink round sprinkles (for the nose) – you can use icing/writing pens if you don't have the above

Mini white marshmallows for the tail, optional









- 1. Put both flours along with the sug<mark>ar and lemon z</mark>est into a la<mark>rge mixing b</mark>owl and stir it. Add th<mark>e cube</mark>s of butter into the bowl and mix into the lemon flour and sugar mixture with the tips of <mark>your fin</mark>gers until you have what looks like fine bread crumbs.
- 2. Then, put in the golden syrup and egg and mix again with a spoon. Make sure to drawn in all the flour from the sides of the bowl until a ball of dough forms finish by using your hands. Bring the dough together into a large ball and split it in half.
- 3. Roll each ball of dough betwee<mark>n two sheets of baking pa</mark>per to the thickness of <mark>a pound coin.</mark> Place each flattened dough into the fridge for 12 minutes and then use your biscuit cutter to cut out the bunny shapes. Place on a lined baking tray and bake in the oven for 12-15 minutes (until the biscuits are a light golden brown). Re roll the offcuts of dough and cut again.
- 4. Once all yo<mark>ur biscuits a</mark>re baked, le<mark>ave to cool down</mark> on a wire rack before decorating. Mix the icing sugar with some water mixing as you go until you reach a thick consistency (you don't want the icing running off the biscuits!).
- 5. Pipe or spoo<mark>n the icing</mark> onto your <mark>biscuits then s</mark>prinkle with the <mark>coconut.</mark> Shake off any exces<mark>s coconut sha</mark>vings then add the final touches by sticking on the eyes and nose and any other dec<mark>oration</mark>s you wish to have.

Mrs Cresswell gave a fab assembly on St Patrick's Day and Patrick's life. We learnt that St Patrick's Day is celebrated all around the world like America, Ireland, England, Japan and so many more countries! He was born in Roman Britain in the late 4th century, he was kidnapped by pirates at the age of 16 and taken to Ireland as a slave. He escaped but returned about 432 CE to convert the Irish to Christianity. By the time of his death on March 17, he had established monasteries, churches, and schools. Many legends grew up around him—for example, that he drove the snakes out of Ireland and used the shamrock to explain the Trinity. Ireland came to celebrate his day with religious services and feasts.
