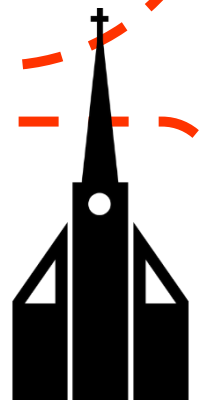
Hope

Annual Services

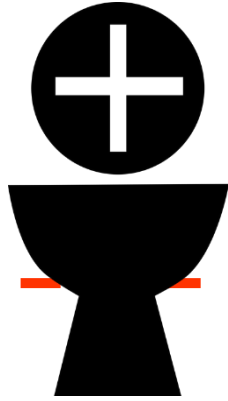

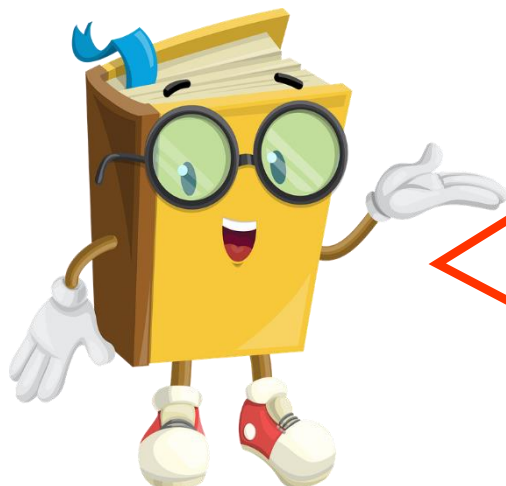

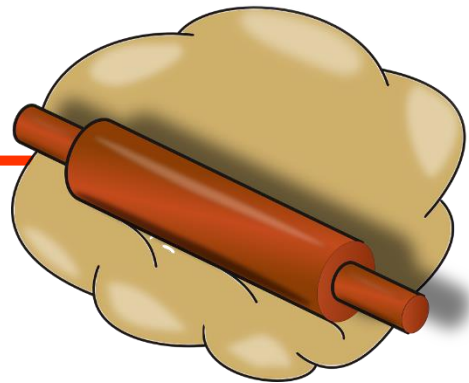
