On Mondays we do a spelling test and a times table test.

We will regularly be using Century and TTRS for homework. Your child's login details are in their reading record or homework diary.

There may be homework set occasionally on a Friday. This will always be due the following Friday.

Please sign your child's homework diary once a week.

— Reading records

A log of when your child reads in school is kept in their reading record.

The teacher/ TA will give a brief comment outlining how the child read and may note any words they struggled with.

If your child is a free reader, they can choose which book to read. We encourage choice when reading in school to foster a genuine love for reading. We monitor the books children read to ensure they are suitably challenging for them.

We expect each child to write in their reading record 3 times a week. An adult at home should sign this once a week. We will check their reading record in school when we read with them.

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The MTC

The MTC is an assessment in late May/ early June taken by all Year Fours in the country. The children will have 25 multiplication questions. They have 6 seconds to answer each question.

TTRS is one of the resources we use to support the children in learning their times tables.



There will be no "pass mark" (expected standard threshold) and no child will "fail" the test.

Multiplication facts will be the only things tested (there will be no testing of children's knowledge of division facts or problem-solving in the check).

The DfE says the purpose of the check is to help teachers identify which children are falling behind and target areas where they're not being given a chance to succeed.

School-level results won't be made publicly available or be used in league / performance tables.

Medicine must always be handed to a member of staff. Please contact the office for a form to complete.

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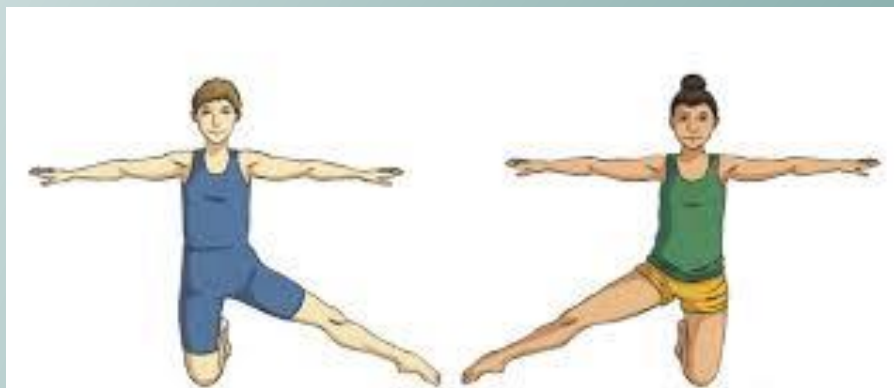

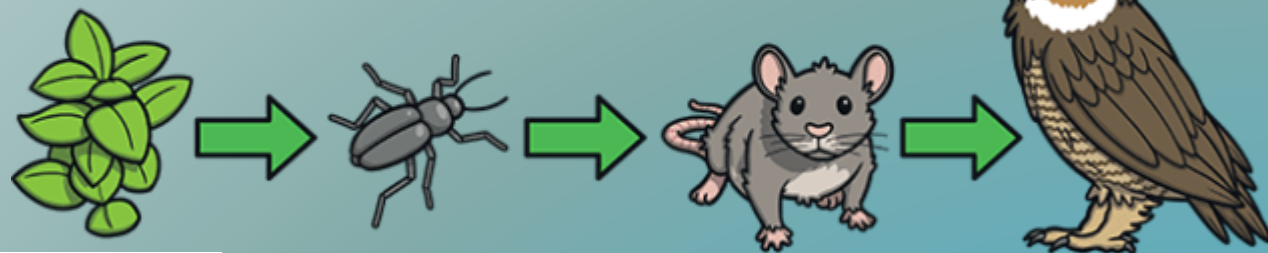

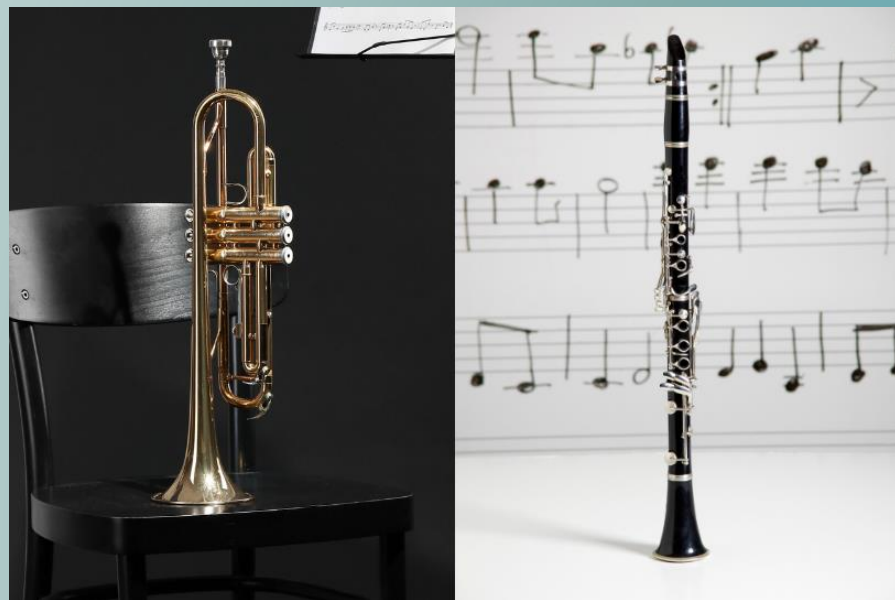
