

HOME SCHOOL AGREEMENT

THE SCHOOL

For our part in this agreement the Executive Headteacher and staff will undertake to

- educate children in accordance with the teaching and principles of the Church of England through a curriculum which is securely based on our Christian vision and core values and which reflects modern British values
- ensure that each child achieves his or her full potential as a valued member of the school community in a safe and secure environment
- let parents know about any concerns or problems that affect their child's work or behaviour
- provide a broad, balanced and inspiring curriculum, with a focus on the progressive acquisition of knowledge and skills, which meets the needs of all the children and fosters their love of learning
- achieve high standards of work and behaviour through building good relationships and developing a sense of responsibility
- treat all members of the community with dignity and respect
- arrange termly opportunities for parent-teacher consultations and provide an interim mid-year report (not Reception) and an annual written report on each child's progress
- keep parents informed about school activities through parents' meetings, regular letters home, newsletters, Parent Portal and the school website
- be open and welcoming at all times and offer opportunities for all parents to become involved in the daily life of the school and to support its work
- support the mental health and well-being of every child.
