




World Book Day

RSPB Big Schools Birdwatch

Over the last couple of weeks, we have taken part in the RSPB Big Schools Birdwatch. Shockingly we have lost 38 million birds from our skies over the last 50 years so it is vital we find ways to help. We have learned about some of the birds common to where we live and have listened to some of their birdsong. The children went into our wild garden to see what they could see and hear. Reception - Making a felted picture

Sabine Fouchier, who is a Milliner by trade, visited us in Reception to teach us how to make a felted picture. We started by feeling the merino wool to see how soft it was before sketching our idea onto paper. We then lay out the felt to make the background of our picture by pulling out strands of the wools fibres and laid them next to each other on the bubble wrap. Next, we chose the colours we wanted to use for our designs. There were lots of different coloured merino wool to choose from. We placed the wool onto our background to start making our design. Once we had finished our design, we had soapy water sprinkled on the felt, then we had to sandwich our felt between bubble wrap and start massaging the felt using our hands to fuse the wool fibres together. Our hands were very soapy! The next step was to roll the felt up into a sausage roll shape, before rolling and squeezing it. Finally, we rolled it into a ball before banging it on the table. This made the picture stronger. Everyone worked really hard and listened to the instruction carefully. So many lovely designs were created and felted pictures made.







Year 1 - Making clay hedgehogs



In Year 1 we learned all about hedgehogs and then made our own. We fashioned the body from clay and then used either pasta, spaghetti or sticks that we had collected from outside for the spines. Then we gave our hedgehog a name.



Year 2 - Puppet making

In Year 2 we were lucky to be involved in a whole day of felt puppet making. We used soft merino wool to layer and make the felt which we placed over a template. After placing the design features onto our template, we then layered the wool with bubble wrap and rubbed over the top of our puppets with water and soap so the wool would stick together. It was a very fun and enjoyable workshop.







Year 3 - Bubble painting

Year 3 had great fun doing bubble painting with Amy Reeves. We experimented mixing colours and then blew them into huge paint bubbles. The children had a great time - the cleaners not so much!







Year 4 - Gamalan

We took part in an Indonesian music workshop in which we got the opportunity to play a range of Gamelan instruments including gongs, saron (a type of xylophone) and bonang (a type of drum). Before we started, we had to take our shoes off and we had to walk around the instruments instead of stepping over them as a sign of respect. We played a sequence of four notes in repetition and really enjoyed the experience.





Year 5 - Lion King

On Wednesday the 9th of February Year 5 took part in a Lion King themed workshop run by Emma from West End in Schools. The session began with an action packed warm up. The class were split into 4 groups and asked to recreate the scenes of the Lion King. To finish off the workshop the class preformed a dance routine based on the ending of the lion king. The children all ended in a pawtastic pose! Everybody found it thoroughly enjoyable!







Year 6 - Making chicken wire sculptures

In Year 6, we were visited by an artist who delivered a chicken wire sculpture workshop. During this session, we created a variety of different animals, including lizards. This tied in with our English focus at the moment, as we are reading Holes by Louis Sachar.
