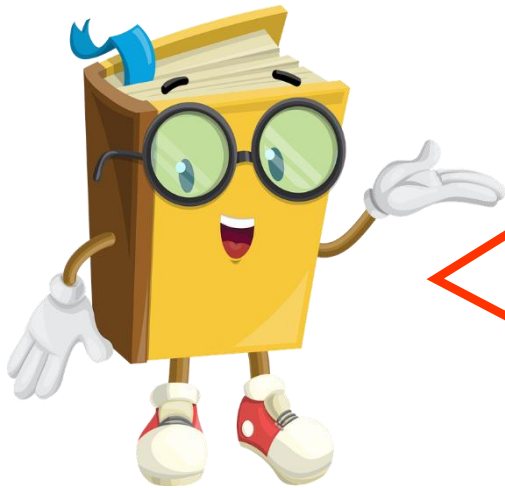

June to promote Black History and celebrate The Windrush Generation and its positive impact on British society.



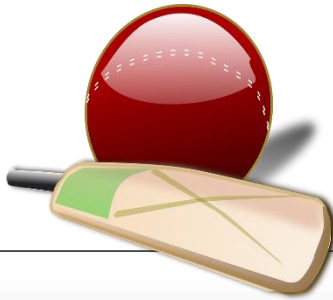

## Sex Education

## Arrangements for the pageant

The pageant will take place at around 3pm (weather permitting) on the fete day. The children will be called on the loud speaker about 15 minutes before and should be in their costumes by then. They need to walk round to the quadrangle through the hall where staff will be ready to supervise them. We ask parents not to come into the quadrangle as it makes it harder to supervise the children. After the pageant children in Reception, Years 1 and 2 should be collected from the dance area and KS2 children will come and find their parents. There will be a member of staff on the front gate to ensure that no child exits without an adult at this time.

The elderly and disabled and anyone who is heavily pregnant may collect a ticket for a seat from the FOSPS at the entrance gate and should then wait at the top of the playground to be seated, showing their ticket. Please could you clear the playground area while Year 6 put out the chairs and any help in clearing the chairs at the end of the pageant would be much appreciated. When we last had a pageant in 2019 everyone followed these instructions and it was a calm and easily managed procedure - it would be wonderful if we could have the same cooperation this year.
